## From the President

"The LORD spoke to Moses, saying, 'Send men to scout the  
land of Canaan, which I am giving to the Israelite people ... .'"  
Thus began last week's Torah portion, Sh'lach L'kha, recounting  
one of the most tragic events in Jewish history. With the  
Israelites poised at the border of the Promised Land, Moses  
sent 12 spies on a reconnaissance mission. They were tasked  
with determining the nature of the land's inhabitants and  
terrain. Unfortunately, when the scouts returned after 40 days,  
all but two provided very negative reports. Though  
acknowledging that the land did, indeed, flow with milk and  
honey, ten spies concluded that the land was unconquerable,  
filled with "giants." The frightened Israelites cast their lot with  
the ten spies. Displeased with the Israelites' lack of faith, God  
condemned a whole generation to die in the wilderness.

In a scouting expedition a bit less momentous in the annals  
of Jewish history, the Dor Hadash Building Search Committee  
members recently spent 40 plus days scouting prospects for  
a future home for the congregation. That reconnaissance  
mission is nearing completion. Under the outstanding  
leadership of Committee Chair Dan Leger, committee  
members narrowed the field of prospects to two: the  
building at the corner of Beacon and Shady that houses  
Congregation Beth Shalom, and the building at the corner of  
Wilkins and Shady that, by year's end, will house both  
Congregation Tree of Life\*Or L'Simcha and New Light  
Congregation. (Although neither building currently flows  
with milk and honey, recent archaeological digs uncovered  
remnants of Rosenbloom's, Silberberg's, Herman's, Waldorf's  
and Isaly's, allowing researchers to conclude that Squirrel Hill  
did, in fact, flow with milk and honey in days of yore. The  
omnipresent "apostrophe s" continues to baffle researchers.)

# RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS

Religious School Graduation was held at the Shabbat service on June 10th. We had a very nice turnout of congregants, school families, even had a few grandparents of the graduates. We appreciate that so many attended. The service included a *Teacher Appreciation*. Students, Sam Nicotra, Hana Lang, Tsemeret and Moraih Ruedenberg-Wright signed up to beautifully praise their teachers. The members of the graduating class shared thoughts about their religious school experience from the bimah. Each student received a certificate and a gift.

Here are some excerpts of what they wrote:

“Being Jewish always felt good. I knew that in the world we are a growing minority and that made me proud of my heritage. Knowing that some of my ancestors went through torture, slavery and killing just to be able to practice Judaism,” I thought giving two hours of my week was not a lot to give for my religion.”

“I used to think of Hebrew class as cramming in who did what, specific events and trying to remember if Tel Aviv or Jerusalem is the capital of Israel. Lately, though, I've been thinking of the values taught that help you find your way in life.”

“Hebrew school helped me to learn more about myself.”

“I have learned not to worry too much about knowing the order of the holidays. But to think about Why do we celebrate these holidays? What do they mean? How does this change me? What can I do? How do I change my actions to help the world and think of every living thing?”

To celebrate Yom Ha'Atzma'ut this year, we did Israeli dancing during class, led by Sharon Serbin, one of our teachers, who taught Israeli dancing for many years. We also played Gaga, an Israeli game popular among the young now: a kind of kickball game but you hit the ball with your hand.

We also did a Sunday cooking session for Yom Ha'atzma'ut, making Israeli salad and hummus. Thanks for Dana Kellerman and Chip and Benjamin Myers for leading the way with their recipes.

Lisa Rothstein, who has been teaching for us for 3 years, was honored on Sunday morning, June 11th at a city-wide program called “UnSung Heroes of Jewish Education.” Lisa has been a major asset to our School and well-deserved the honor. She taught this year's 7th grade graduating class in 5th & 6th grade, and taught this year's 6th grade. Two of her students and their parents came to the program in appreciation for all she has done for them.
