

Dor Hadash Shabbat Morning Service Outline -

In preparation for the service:

- If you select a theme – an upcoming holiday, peace, the Torah portion, etc., consider selecting prayers, readings, or songs related to your theme.
- Please check with Hal Grinberg (DHRS principal) for prayers and readings the children have prepared to lead. Involve the children when you can.
- Torah honors and a Torah reader will be arranged separately.
- Hal arranges the “teaching moment” prior to the Torah service.

Be mindful of the time. Plan to end at 11:45.
